
- generation of induced pluripotent stem cells

The first edition of this classic work appeared more than 20 years ago, with authors that included Brigid Hogan, Rosa Beddington, Frank Costantini, and Elizabeth Lacy. The field's technological sophistication has grown exponentially but the manual remains the essential practical and theoretical guide for all students, lab technicians, and investigators who work with mice.
